Message from Father

Happy Easter! Easter is a time of joy and rejoicing. Christians are joyful people because they have meaning and purpose in their lives, and you don't need much else to be joyful. It doesn't come from money or fame if our modern culture has taught us anything

St. Paul tells us in Philippians: "rejoice in the Lord always, I will say it again: Rejoice!". He mandates this attitude of rejoicing because he knows how intent the devil is on taking away our joy. Be It Done unto Me

The world is changed forever. Today Christ, having died for our sins, rose from the grave and cut the sinews of sin and death that had held us captive since man fell from grace.

Pope Benedict XVI speaks vividly to our imagination of the profound beauty of the Cross and the Church's recognition of its significance in his homily from Palm Sunday, 2007, reminding us of the spiritual reality of the Passion:

In the old liturgy for Palm Sunday, the priest, arriving in front of the church, would knock loudly with the shaft of the processional cross on the door that was still closed; thereupon, it would be opened. This was a beautiful image of the mystery of Jesus Christ himself who, with the wood of his Cross, with the power of his love that is given, knocked from the side of the world at God's door; on the side of a world that was not able to find access to God. With his Cross, Jesus opened God's door, the door between God and men. Now it is open.

I have been considering Our Lady's answer to the angel Gabriel: *Be it done to me according to thy word.* It is wonderful to consider Mary's acceptance of God's will acting through her life, but it is quite another to apply those words to ourselves, to accept without reservation everything that God might will for us. And yet hers is the answer to the knock – from God's side of the door – that Christ is waiting for.

Brotherhood with God is great – what could be better! – but obedience is the trick, is it not? Venerable Fulton J. Sheen observed that "civilization is always in danger when those who have never learned to obey are given the right to command." Our souls, too, are in danger if we never learned to become obedient, if we've accepted no kingship but our own, preferring the darkness that we know. The Cross knocking on the Church door announces the grand result of the pains of birth, that passage from darkness into light, from death to resurrection. Christ's knock on our door is an invitation to relinquish the control of our hearts into the hands of the Almighty.

Today there is no need to dwell on sin. Turn our gaze to the Risen Christ. And think on those words, said to the angelic messenger, so full of portent for one woman, so necessary for all mankind, in order that we too, according to His word, will rise with Christ this morning!



Catechism of the Catholic Church

On this glorious solemnity, we reveal what the Catechism says about Easter.

(CCC 1169) Easter is not simply one feast among others, but the "Feast of feasts," the "Solemnity of solemnities," just as the Eucharist is the "Sacrament of sacraments." The mystery of the Resurrection, in which Christ crushed death, permeates with its powerful energy our old time, until all is subjected to Him.

(CCC 638) "We bring you the good news that what God promised to the fathers, this day He has fulfilled to us their children by raising Jesus" (Acts 13:32-33). The resurrection of Jesus is the crowning truth of our faith in Christ, a faith believed and lived as the central truth by the first Christian community; handed on as fundamental by Tradition; established by the documents of the New Testament; and preached to us as an essential part of the Paschal mystery along with the cross:

"Christ is risen from the dead!

Dying, He conquered death;

To the dead, He has given life"

(Byzantine Liturgy, Troparion of Easter).


