### Pastoral Council Column

#### Archbishop Vigano's Reply to Sr. Antonietta Potente

On June 17 an Italian nun, Sr. Antonietta Potente (Theologian of the Union of Dominican Sisters of Saint Thomas Aquinas and community) wrote a public letter to Archbishop Carlo Maria Vigano, beginning: "We are deeply indignant at the words that you, a christian and a bishop" and so forth, taking Abp. Vigano to task for his letter to President Trump and, in turn, castigating Trump for racism, war mongering, xenophobia, homophobia, etc.

Archbishop Vigano replied with a response that sets a standard for Catholic teaching and charitable correction. I have made edits for clarity [square brackets] and have broken his response into 3 parts for this column:

##### Part 1

Reverend Mother,

I have read the open letter that you sent to me [...] I remain bewildered by several expressions in your letter: not only those regarding me personally, but also the showy misrepresentation of reality in accusing President Trump of being [quoting from Potente's letter] *"the proponent of a policy that, in recent months, has shown itself to be increasingly discriminatory and violent, both with regard to the health emergency and these latest events of racism."*

In truth, I do not see how one can make him responsible for the events of racism, which have arisen [in places] where the police and the local governments are in the hands of the Democratic Party, and which [it is increasingly evident] have been orchestrated by the false flag financed by the globalist elites precisely in order to oppose the Republican Party and the President currently in office.

At the international level, Trump's term of office is the only one for a long time in which the United States has not started any military conflicts, and in many cases, peace treaties have been established and foreign military deployments have been withdrawn. The economy was in strong growth (until the COVID emergency), and thus also the protection of the rights of workers.

If then you maintain that establishing public order and demanding respect for the law is a discriminatory action, I fear that I have to remind you that civil authority has a moral duty to impose respect for the laws, and in order to do this, it is permitted to use proportionate force: this doctrine is taught and wonderfully explained by St. Thomas Aquinas, the patron of the Institute to which you belong.

I do not believe that the President is *"violent in words and also in actions,"* certainly no more than those [politicians who] favor and support the killing of millions of children right up until the moment before birth and even after birth: this violence, much more hateful since it rages the most against those who are the most defenseless, does not

appear to me to quite be in accord with your commitment as a religious sister. *(to be continued)*

### Catechism of the Catholic Church

In the *Little Catechism on the Eucharist* we find the following story about Blesseds Francisco and Jacinta Marto (The apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima, Portugal, 1917).

Around the ages of eight and six respectively, Francisco and Jacinta started to take their father's little flock to graze. While caring for the sheep, they usually joined their flock with their uncle's flock, taken to pasture by their cousin Lucia, who was a little older.

The three children would spend nearly the whole day outdoors watching the sheep. It was while tending their little flock that, in the autumn of 1916, the three children had an extraordinary encounter with the Angel of the Eucharist.

As Lucia said later, on that occasion an angel appeared to them; he was holding a chalice in his left hand while with his right hand he held over it a Host from which drops of blood fell into the chalice.

The angel knelt beside the three children, inviting them to repeat three times the following prayer: "Most Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, I adore You profoundly and I offer You the most precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, present in all tabernacles of the world, in reparation for the outrages, sacrileges and indifferences by which He is offended. By the infinite merits of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I beg you the conversion of sinners."

After having raised the chalice and the Host, the angel gave the Host to Lucia and invited Jacinta and Francisco to drink the contents of the chalice.

As he did so he said: "Take and drink the Body and the Blood of Jesus Christ, horribly outraged by ungrateful mankind. Make reparation for their crimes and console your God."

Prostrating once again, he repeated three times the same prayer: "Most Holy Trinity....." and then disappeared.

From that day onwards, Francisco and Jacinta felt a growing desire to receive Jesus present in the Eucharist and felt a compelling need to spend long periods of time before the tabernacle. "The hidden Jesus" was their favorite expression for the Blessed Sacrament.

On May 13, 1917, while the three children were pasturing their flock near the Cova da Iria, they witnessed an apparition of Our Lady, who ordered them to come back to the same place every thirteenth day of the month until October. In one of these apparitions, the Blessed Virgin showed them Hell.

Our Lady asked the children to pray and sacrifice for sinners, mostly by participating in the Mass and by reciting the Rosary.

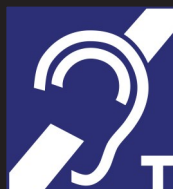
