### Pastoral Council Column

#### **Being and Holiness**

I fear I have caught the virus. No, not that one; rather, one that masks the soul: *Cogito, ergo sum* – I think, therefore I am. I believe that spells it out. Fortunately, I know the cure.

That particular thought has undermined man's relationship with God since long before it was ever uttered by Descartes, the "philosophical architect of our modern world." Some architect. A more inverted piece of brainwork is hard to imagine. An alcoholic might well say: I drink, therefore I am. Or a murderer, I kill, therefore...

Such statements may seem ridiculous on their face. However, we are strongly tempted to believe a more common notion: *I'm alive, therefore I am.* But at the bottom of that cup hides a poisoned pill, because if it were true, then we cease to exist when our hearts stop beating.

But no, and no. We *are* because God made us, and God did not make us to be extinguished. All the mayhem we see around us – and the trouble we ourselves create – is just humanity asserting its independence, unwilling to give the simple fact of our supernatural Creator just due.

God gave us minds and senses to perceive beauty. He created us out of love, and the array of His gifts is ordered so that we might have the greatest joy: to know, love, and serve Him. But in order to be with Him in eternity, we are called to be holy: You therefore must be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect.

Scott Hahn wrote (along, no doubt, with a few other people on his mailing list) to let me know that he is writing a new book on holiness. His introductory letter began:

When Christians use the word 'holy,' we usually mean someone who is good, who is prayerful, charitable, and long-suffering. But God's holiness is a consuming fire. It surpasses what our minds can comprehend. And yet, that's the holiness we're called to possess.

He did not say how we are to possess it but, knowing Mr. Hahn, his answer will include Baptism, Confession, and the Eucharist.

And yet, to use myself as an example, we can in a half-hearted way engage in all those things and still lack holiness. The saints, from all I have read, do not regard themselves as holy, but their self-assessment comes from a condition of holiness that sees the wretchedness of their fallen condition, whereas if I am ever inclined to think that I'm holy, it is because I am, on some level, pleased with myself. Of course that impression evaporates quickly, for my personal feelings change within the

moment. Saint John of the Cross is reported to have said, "He who has himself as guide has an idiot as a disciple."

Which brings me back to Descartes. He referenced himself – the fact of his thinking – to define *being*. But in fact we know almost nothing about ourselves – at least nothing of any importance – if not first through knowledge and love of God. And holiness... let's face it, when we compare ourselves to Perfection, the distance between us and God is vast.

To try for holiness, we must give everything to God, turning away from ourselves. We must lose our selfish preoccupations, our individual truths, our petty angers, disappointments, and wants. Focus instead on Jesus Christ, keeping close to His Sacraments and Commandments, reading His holy word. Ask Our Mother for help to see our neighbor – particularly those who are unlikable – through her Son's eyes, trusting God to burn our selfishness from us so that we can live ever more fully with Jesus Christ. Then, let us pray that because God wills it we will be drawn upward into holiness.

#### Catechism of the Catholic Church

We now begin our series on the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, formally known as Extreme Unction. This sacrament, which was instituted by Christ sometime before His ascent into heaven, continues His healing ministry. When Jesus began to send the Apostles two by two he gave them power over unclean spirits "and they cast out many devils, and anointed with oil many that were sick, and healed them" (Mark 6:13).

Illness and suffering have always been part of the human condition and can be one of the gravest problems confronted in human life. Serious illness may cause individuals to experience life changing limitations and powerlessness. Such illnesses can make us glimpse death. They can lead to self-absorption, anguish, despair, and sometimes may even lead people to a revolt against God. Serious illness can also make a person discover strength in trials making a person more mature. Serious illness can help us reevaluate both what is essential, and what is not essential in our life. Also, it can often provoke a search for God and/or a return to Him.

The sacrament of Anointing can provide spiritual assistance to those who are sick by strengthening the supernatural life of the recipient's soul and forgives sins under certain conditions. If God wills it, Anointing can also restore physical health to the seriously ill Christian.

Next week we shall consider details about Extreme Unction and reasons for the name change.




