Pastoral Council Column

The Homily

Is there such a thing as too long a homily? Perish the thought! ...although I do admit to having been caught up – only on the *very rarest* occasions – in a kind of dreaminess...

But what about St. Paul's discourse, begun on a Sunday that extended even until the sun rose Monday morning? St. Luke reports:

And on the first day of the week, when we were assembled to break bread [say Mass], Paul discoursed with them, being to depart on the morrow: and he continued his speech until midnight (*Acts* 20:7).

Paul had a lot to say! Midnight, in fact, did not end it, but

he was interrupted by a young man's falling asleep and then out the window – to his death, says Luke, and being a physician he should know.

Eutychus, sitting on the window, being oppressed with a deep sleep, (as Paul was long preaching,) by occasion of his sleep fell from the third loft down, and was taken up dead.

But just before writing that sentence, he added a curious detail: "And there were a great number of lamps in the upper chamber where we were assembled."

Some commentators – because, as you know, people have scraped every single word of scripture to glean some meaning from it – have suggested that Luke included the lamps by way of a medical explanation, that the fumes made Eutychus drowsy.

But why blame the lamps? Depending on which translation is used, Luke is succinct; in the Douay-Rheims translation, "...as Paul was long preaching." Other translations hold long preaching as more of an aside, but nowhere are there reports of general asphyxiation.

Another commentator said that the evangelist was warning us against the evils of becoming spiritually sleepy, but... I cannot help but think that his was the voice of experience, an exasperation with his flock's snoozing in the pews. And is it not possible that Luke pointed to the brightly lit room to dissuade from the notion that dim lighting lulled Eutychus to sleep?

But no matter the reason. Paul climbed down the three flights and brought Eutychus back to life. And then he went back up, and "having talked a long time to them, until daylight, so he departed."

Perhaps what is most extraordinary – the boy returned to life excepted – is that the news of Jesus Christ was so enlivening to the assembled group that they stayed up all night to listen, to hear more about this astonishing hope, this deeper dive into the mystery of God 's design – and our participation in it. Imagine their joy and fascination at the scriptures become newly alive. I sometimes think that our impatience to get back to our mundane lives is that we have heard these things too many times; and with insufficient identification with the depth of our Jewish traditions, are cut off from our divine roots and take salvation for granted. The world, obviously, has found more excitement in denying that there is any such thing, blaming religious conviction for the evils afflicting themselves and mankind. But the times are rapidly changing, and I sense that even though - or rather precisely because darker times are coming, we are experiencing a reawakening of our desire to know the truth of God's love, and to hear the news of Christ crucified, Risen from the dead, and Ascended into Heaven, body and soul! - proclaimed.




