Monsignor De Rocher for Holy Week March 18-25, 1951. This bulletin was found in the rectory in a box of papers, old bulletins, and other materials left by our former pastor. Msgr. De Rocher used to write and type the bulletin each week. He had a very gentle and fatherly tone to his messages. Parishioners who remember Msgr. De Rocher speak fondly of him as St. Mary's pastor for 21 years (1947-1968).

Reading the Palm Sunday bulletin reveals some of the differences in the way the faith was practiced in the 1950s. There were two daily Masses, one at 6:50 AM and 8:15 AM. Back then, most people went to communion a few times a year and only after going to Confession first. In 1951, Confession was held on Wednesday and Saturday of Holy Week for 4-5 hours each day. Msgr. De Rocher gently encouraged, "We suggest that you try to come to Confession Wednesday, so that you can receive Holy Communion Thursday, Saturday and Easter Sunday."

Holy Thursday was the "Anniversary Day of the First Mass, the First Communion, the First Priests." Holy Communion was distributed at 7:00 AM followed by 8:15 AM Mass and Procession to the Repository with Adoration all day and night until Noon on Good Friday. There was a Holy Hour on Thursday evening.

For Good Friday Monsignor De Rocher wrote, "It seems proper to ask all worthy Christians to halt other activities during these three hours, and to spend them with Christ on the Cross." The service was called *Tre Ore* or Three Hours. From Noon until 3:00 PM, St. Mary's parishioners participated in the Mass, Novena, short sermons, meditations and stations.

The Holy Saturday Easter Vigil began at 7:30 PM with the Blessing of Fire, Font, Easter Candle, just like we do today. There were four Easter Sunday Masses: 6:00 AM, 7:30 AM, 9:00 AM, 10:30 AM. The Communion fast at this time was much stricter. People usually had to fast from midnight until Holy Communion. Therefore, only Holy Saturday Mass was held in the evening.

In 1951, Msgr. De Rocher had two assistant priests, Father Joseph Brown and Father Harry Lauters who helped with administering the Sacraments to the growing congregation in post-World War II America.

As we worship our Triumphant Lord today and all this week, let us be grateful to be able to attend Mass and add our prayers with all the faithful St. Mary's parishioners who have gone before us and be forever united with them through our Lord Jesus Christ in the Mass and Eucharist.

Monsignor De Rocher's closing remark was, "HOLY WEEK - May it be that for you!"
