Catechism of the Catholic Church

The Gospels provide vivid descriptions of the Lord performing miracles of healing. He cured the sick and consoled the afflicted. After sending out the Apostles, they continued His work by casting out devils in His name and anointing sick people with oil. Today it is the bishops and priests who carry out the Anointing of the Sick. It is not possible for deacons, consecrated persons, or members of the laity to confer this sacrament, even in an emergency. Priests alone have received the power to forgive sins through absolution and/or sacramental anointing.

"Is any man sick among you? Let him bring in the priests of the Church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer of faith shall save the sick man, and the Lord shall raise him up, and if he be in sins, they shall be forgiven him" (James 5:14-15). All baptized Catholics who have reached the age of reason (usually around age 7) and are in danger of death due to illness, accident or physically weakened by old age, should receive Anointing of the Sick. Ordinarily a person may receive the sacrament only once in the same illness. If the person recovers and later falls seriously sick again, even if from the same disease, then the sacrament may be received again. If a person has been anointed and later becomes more seriously ill, anointing may be repeated. Additionally, the sacrament may be received before surgery if it is necessary due to a dangerous illness or if it is to be done under general anesthesia.

Anointing is considered a sacrament of the living, which means a person must be in the state of grace to receive it fruitfully. This is why it is necessary for a person in the state of mortal sin to receive the sacrament of Penance prior to being anointed, unless he/she is unable to do so.

Next week we shall consider conditional anointing and the sacramental rite.
